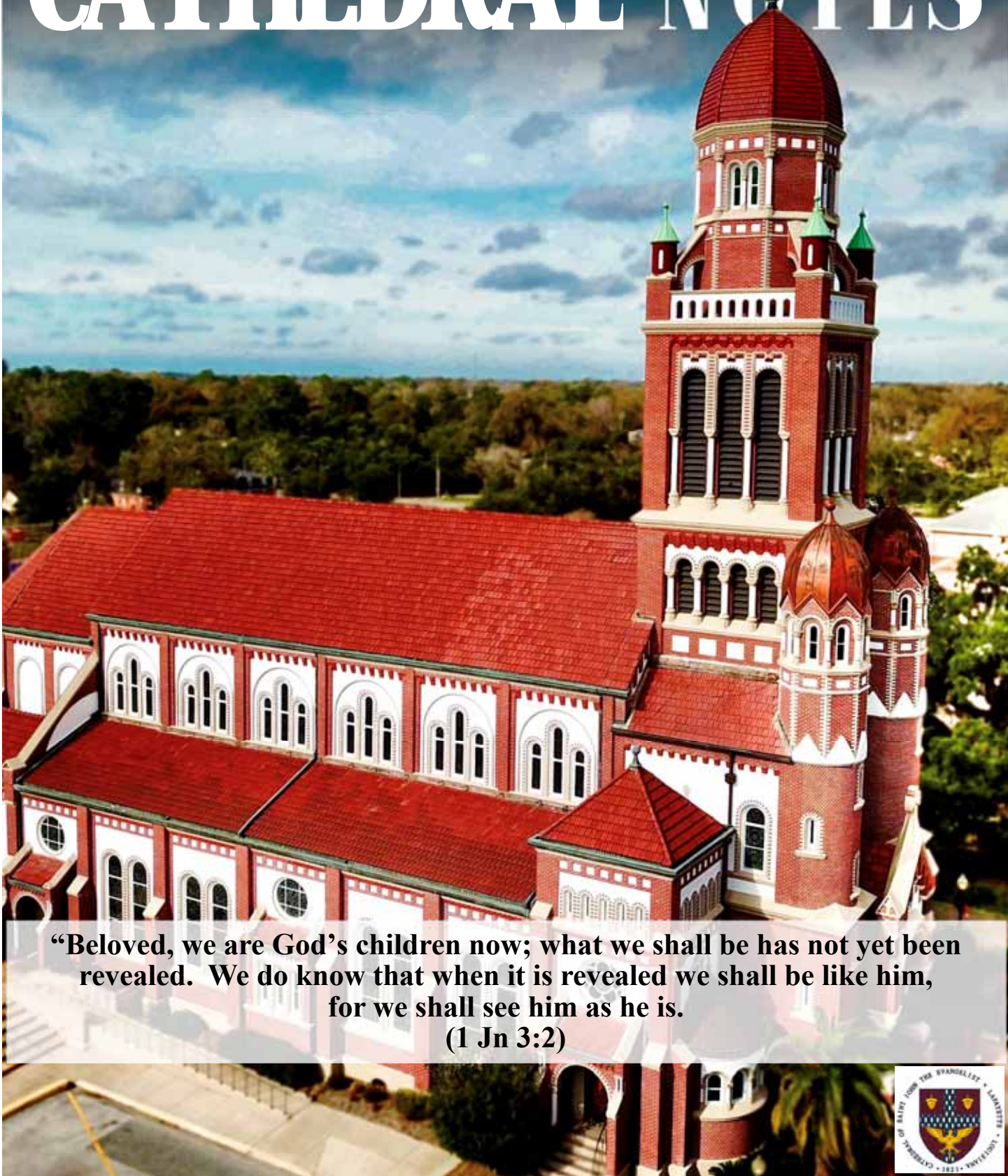

GOSPEL REFLECTION

All Saints Day

In today's Gospel, Jesus teaches his followers about "blessedness," a word not used much in American culture. The Beatitudes that Jesus evokes in this Gospel reading are not promises of happiness, but promises of a new life with God. Blessedness is key to a new way of living through the human experiences of mourning, meekness, peacemaking, persecution and poverty of spirit. For Christian stewards, "blessedness" does not depend on wealth or health or status. Rather, Christian stewards recognize that blessedness is God's gift. In the kingdom of God, life is not governed by honor and fame, but by promise of abundant life. Embracing a poverty of spirit and meekness reveals God's abundant life "breaking into" our world.

ALL SAINTS' DAY MASS SCHEDULE - SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 1

The Mass schedule for All Saints' Day will be our **Regular Sunday Mass Schedule**. It is as follows: **7:00 a.m., 9:00 a.m. (with Bishop Deshotel), 11:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.** The **Anticipated Mass** will be at **4:00 p.m.** on **Saturday, October 31**. We invite everyone to join us after the **9:00 a.m. Mass for the Blessing of the Tombs**. An indulgence is granted to the Christian faithful who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, if only momentarily, for the dead. This indulgence is applicable only to the souls in purgatory. This indulgence is a plenary one normally from November 1 through November 8 and can be gained on each of these days; however, the Vatican extended the indulgence, due to COVID restrictions, and includes the entire month of November. On the other days of the year, this indulgence is a partial one.

A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

My Dear Parishioners,

As we enter the month of “**Thanksgiving**” - November, let us collect our thoughts and ponder on all the blessings our Lord has given to each of us in the midst of such an irrational year. We must not lose sight that even though we are in the heart of a world-wide pandemic, which has brought much suffering, the Lord is transforming our lives and allowing His spirit to dwell within us. **As in the words of St. Anthony of Padua, “We stumble. We stutter. We rise. We are lifted.”** Just as the Lord has assisted each of us to rise throughout our own sorrow in 2020, let us remember to be mindful of our neighbor and assist them to rise from their faults, their failings and their sufferings.

Even in the midst of this pandemic, Cathedral is vibrantly alive and prospering. During this past year, we have continued to celebrate the many Sacraments within the life of our parish. They are as follows: **Baptisms - 113; First Communions - 96; Confirmations - 59; Marriages - 37; Deaths - 115.** What a beautiful testament of faith! We have also registered **69 students for the CCD program.** Our **Youth Group consisted of 15 young men and women** seeking to know more about the love of Our Lord. Last, but certainly not least, our **RCIA Program had a total of 21 candidates** who entered the Catholic Church. It is such a blessing to see Cathedral parish flourishing as we enter into our Bi-Centennial year.

Within the next few pages of the bulletin, you will find the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist’s Parish Financial Statement for the fiscal year 2019/2020. I am beyond thankful and deeply humbled to all the parishioners of Cathedral Parish who unwaveringly kept their financial commitments and remained steadfast in their tithing to our Mother Church. **We are a blessed, faith-filled community!** Because of your faithful stewardship and continuous generosity, we were able to cultivate a beautiful online Evangelization mission which continues to this day. I am so grateful for my wonderful staff who stepped out of their comfort zones and became creative in the digital world. We were able to reach countless people throughout the United States and around the world through our daily Evangelization approaches such as: the praying of the Rosary, the ever popular Schu Box, the beautiful streaming of Daily Mass, the wealth of knowledge we have gathered in Faith Formation through Formed, and the ever prayerful recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet at the merciful Three O’clock Hour. We also streamed our weekly Adoration and Benediction Holy Hour along with our weekly recitation of the French Rosary for all our French speaking parishioners. Wow, God is SO Good even amid the various trials and sufferings of a pandemic.

In the fiscal year of July 2019 to June of 2020, Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist has completed many projects. These include the completion of our beautiful Mausoleum Chapel along with the completion of the pavilion between the Youth Center and the Spirituality Center. We have also replaced flooring and painted in the Cathedral Center, giving our office space a more unified look. We have hired a new museum curator, Mrs. Kristi Munzing, who stepped into the role after the retirement of our beloved Mrs. Janice McNeil. We would like to gratefully thank Mrs. Jan, as she is known by all, for her countless years of service and wealth of history to Cathedral Parish. She was the backbone in establishing the museum along with the gathering of most of its artifacts. Her loving presence is deeply missed and forever cherished.

Mrs. Kristi Munzing has blessed the Parish with her extensive expertise of Church History. She has even revitalized the museum to embrace the digital age. The successful Living Nativity, in December of 2019, was spearheaded by Kristi and she is currently focused on planning our upcoming Bi-Centennial Celebration. We are so extremely fortunate to have her on staff and cannot wait to see her talents unfold before us. We have also hired a Parish Ministries Coordinator, Mrs. Christie Domingue, who returned to Cathedral Parish after a short two-year absence. Christie oversees our bulletin, our Liturgical Ministers and the scheduling of Lectors, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Altar Servers. Furthermore, she manages the different ministries here at Cathedral and looks after some of our elderly parishioners. It has been such a joy and a blessing to have her back on staff with us. We joyously welcomed The Sisters of Sorrows to Cathedral parish. They now reside in the Martin House, Msgr. Mouton's former residence. Sister Fatima, OLS, is the Mother Superior and has been graciously helping at CCS with overseeing the girls group. As we moved into the 2020/2021 fiscal year, Sister Fatima took over the role as Director of Religious Education. She is currently the administrator of our CCD Program on Wednesday evenings. We are blessed to have their presence in the life of our parish.

All these completions and additions have brought forth order and allowed us to function in a more organized fashion. For example, the Mausoleum Chapel can now hold burials inside which allow family members a more peaceful and private service. In fact, fewer than 100 spaces remain for purchase. The crypts, which were presold, provided a significant revenue boost this fiscal year. Such a blessing during this year of 2020! Additionally, our Youth Group, under the direction of Mr. Chad Beraud, can now use the covered pavilion for outdoor gatherings which has helped him tremendously during the outbreak of COVID-19. Our youth can still participate in spiritually filled activities and enjoy each other's company following the guidelines of social distancing.

For the 2020/2021 fiscal year, my plan is to replace roofs of the older mausoleums, have work done to the main sidewalks and allow for more landscaping projects inside the cemetery. It is also my hope to build two Columbariums. The year 2021 is also our Bi-Centennial Year, and we have special plans for the parish. A list of celebrations and plans will be coming soon! As you look over the financials, please keep in mind that our Finance Council prayerfully decided to lower anticipated income and expenditures for the 2020/2021 fiscal year. This is due in part to a unique year and the uncertainty it has brought. Also note that when you read the financials, they are in reverse order of giving. The 2018/2019 fiscal year numbers precede those for 2019/2020. If you should have any questions and/or concerns, please feel free to call the office and speak with our Parish Finance Coordinator, Mrs. Andrea Polito.

Thank you, once again, for your continued dedication to Cathedral Parish! It is such a pleasure and honor to be your Pastor. Please know that I constantly pray for you and your family. I am your shepherd and you are my people. Your soul, your safety and your happiness are truly important to me. May Mary, our Mother, drape her mantle of protection upon each of us. May she guide us ever so closely to her Son, Jesus Christ, our greatest gift, who reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God forever and ever. Amen.

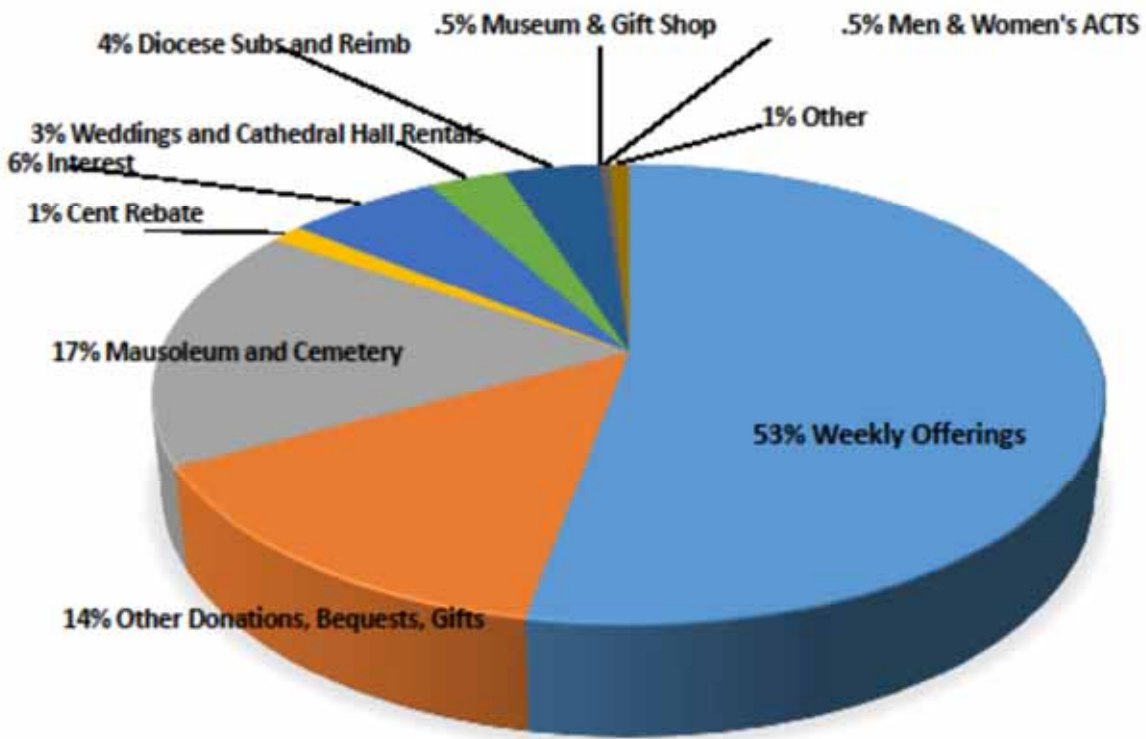

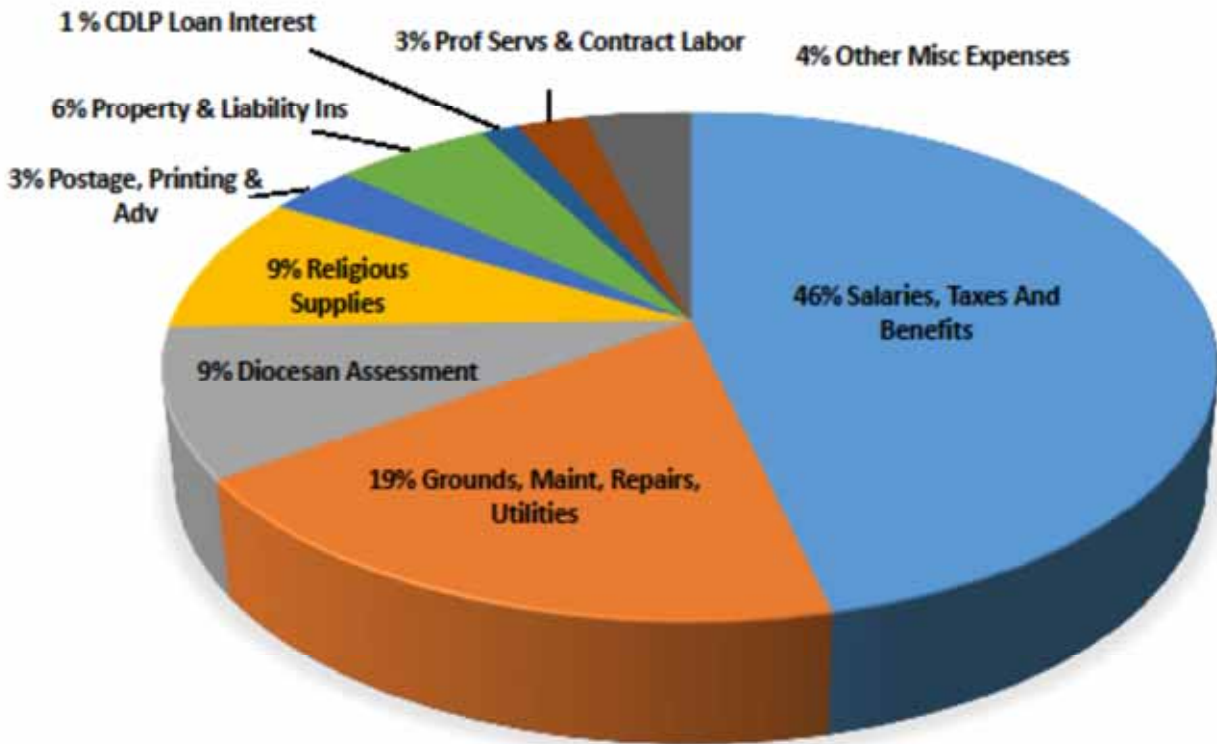
