A Message from Fr. Arceneaux

My Dear Parishioners:

Throughout my priesthood, I have tried with all my strength to remind people of what belongs to us in Christ Jesus. It is so easy for the distractions of this world and the sins that work to rob and steal from us that which is ours. We are beloved children of God and possess everything by possessing Jesus.

In our Gospel from John this Sunday, the woman at the well discovers Jesus and what he can offer her. He tells her that if she would let him, he would give her living water that would quench her thirst forever. And you know what? She believed him. She was not a Jew and was living a life of sin, but something stirred in her heart and soul that caused her to recognize the gift that was before her in Christ Jesus.

What stirred in her heart was the gift of grace. She responded in Faith and was able to bless her own life and the life of her community. So I ask you today, do you know what you possess in Jesus Christ? Do you know “the gift of God” that is before you in the Person of Christ? Use this holy time of Lent to quiet the distractions and the sin, and recognize the river of living water you have in knowing and loving Christ Jesus.

Bishop Deshotel Declares "Year of St. Joseph"

150 years ago, Pope Pius IX declared St. Joseph as the Universal Patron of the Church. In light of this anniversary, Bishop Deshotel has established a year of St. Joseph in the Diocese of Lafayette from March 19th of this year until March 19th of 2021. During this year, we as a diocese will meditate on St. Joseph's life, befriend him in prayer, and seek his protection.
