A Message from Fr. Arceneaux



My Dear Parishioners:

“I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing!” In the Gospel this Sunday from Luke, our Lord shares his pastoral zeal for souls. I know as a priest it is so important for me to examine my own heart often to ask myself, “Is my soul on fire for the Lord? Am I spreading that fire to others?”

These are questions you should be asking yourself as well. Every baptized Christian is set on fire with the love of God through the grace of that Sacrament. During the Baptismal Rite parents and godparents are given a candle to represent the new flame of divine life within the child. They are instructed to help keep that flame burning until the child meets the Lord at the end of their life.

How is your flame? Is the Lord looking at your heart this Sunday and saying to himself, “How I wish it was already burning?” Let him rekindle the flame of his love within your life.
