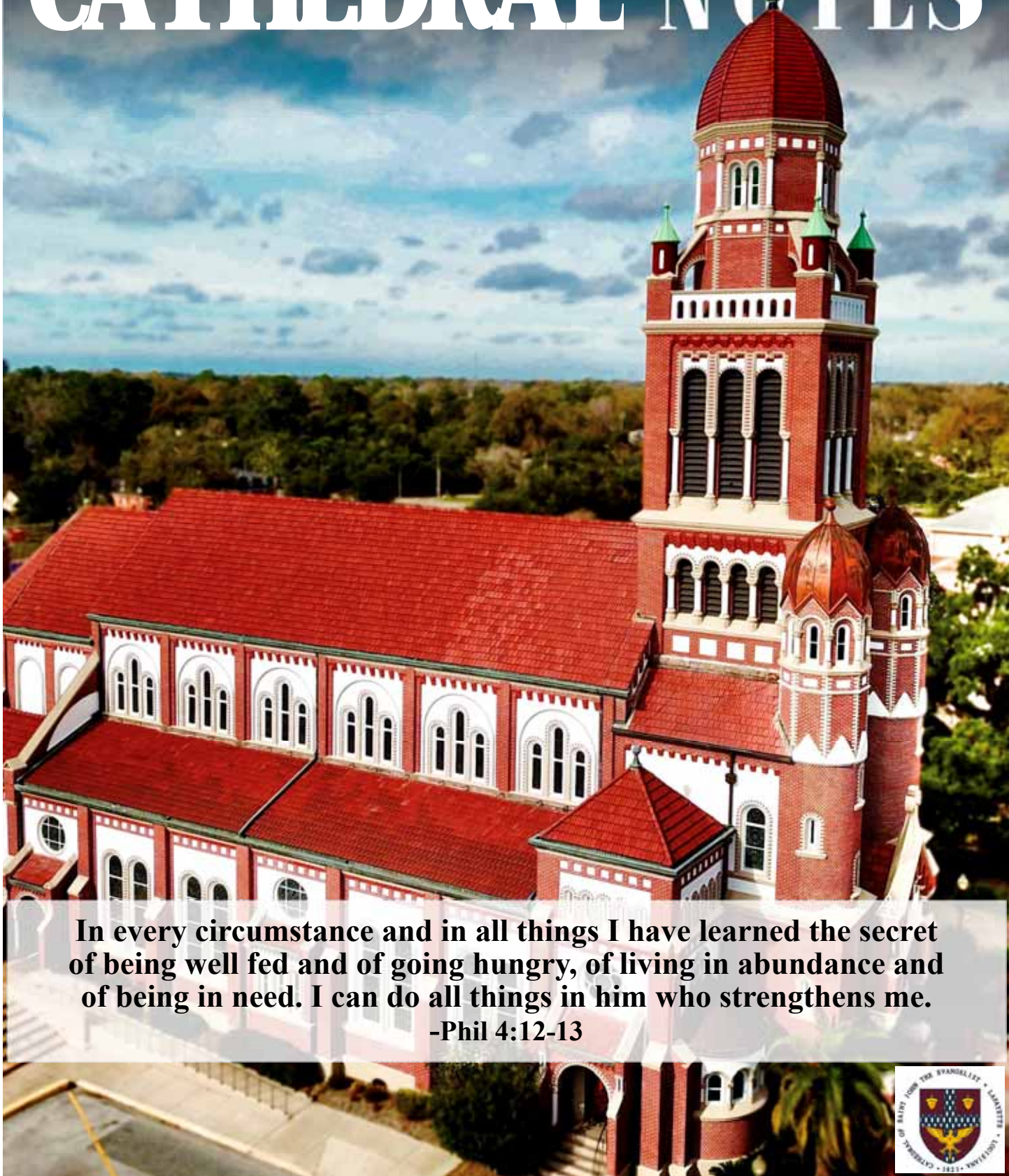

Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

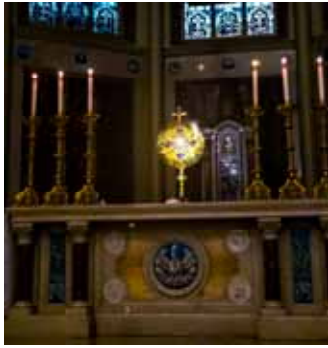

RESPECT LIFE MONTH - OCTOBER 2020

“Before birth the Lord called me, from my mother’s womb he gave me my name.” -Isaiah 49:1



The truth of the Gospel of life is at the foundation of who we are as followers of Christ. In his earthly life, Jesus provided the perfect model for how we are to love our neighbor and live out the Gospel call:

“Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me.” (Mt. 25:40)

Jesus calls each of us to “care for the other as a person for whom God has made us responsible.” (EV 87) The Gospel of life is intrinsic to the whole Christian life and foundational to the decisions we make on a daily basis. For, “the Gospel of God’s love for man, the Gospel of the dignity of the person and the Gospel of life are a single and indivisible Gospel.” (EV 2, emphasis added)

OCTOBER 2020 - MONTH OF THE ROSARY

The Five First Saturdays: Mary’s Great Promise at Fatima

The Five First Saturdays are intended to honor and to make reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary for all the blasphemies and ingratitude of people. This devotion and the wonderful promises connected with it were revealed by the Blessed Virgin at Fatima, a small village in Portugal. Our Lady appeared to three children there in 1917, and one of the little girls, Lucy, tells us that she said:

“I promise to help at the hour of death, with the graces needed for salvation, whoever on the First Saturday of five consecutive months shall:

Confess and receive Communion;

Recite five decades of the Rosary;

And keep me company for fifteen minutes while meditating on the fifteen Mysteries of the Rosary, with the intention of making reparation to me.”



Our Lady of the Rosary, Pray for Us

Since October is “The Month of the Rosary,” we will honor Our Lady by reciting the Memorare Prayer after all Masses. It will replace the St. Michael prayer. May Our Lady’s mantle of protection drape over you and your family and surround all of you with love.
