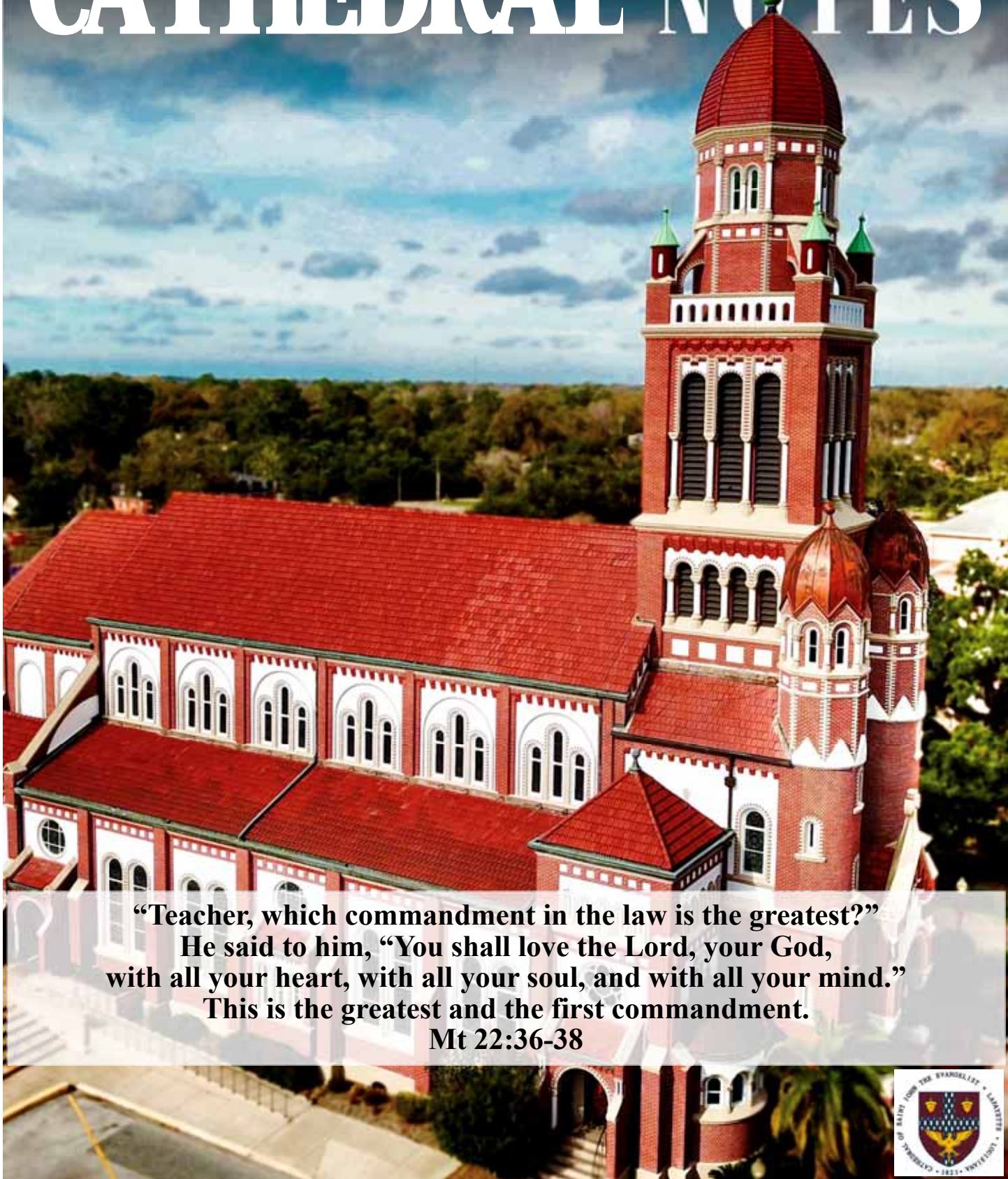

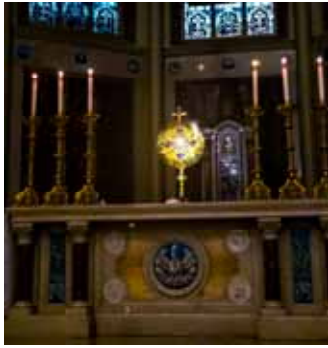
Prayer for the Deceased

ALL SAINTS' DAY MASS SCHEDULE - SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 1

The Mass schedule for **All Saints' Day** will be our **Regular Sunday Mass Schedule**. It is as follows: **7:00 a.m., 9:00 a.m. (with Bishop Deshotel), 11:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.** The **Anticipated Mass** will be at **4:00 p.m.** on **Saturday, October 31**. We invite everyone to join us after the **9:00 a.m. Mass for the Blessing of the Tombs**. An indulgence is granted to the Christian faithful who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, if only momentarily, for the dead. This indulgence is applicable only to the souls in purgatory. This indulgence is a plenary one from November 1 through November 8 and can be gained on each of these days. On the other days of the year, this indulgence is a partial one. "It is, therefore, a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from sin." (2 Mach. 12:46)

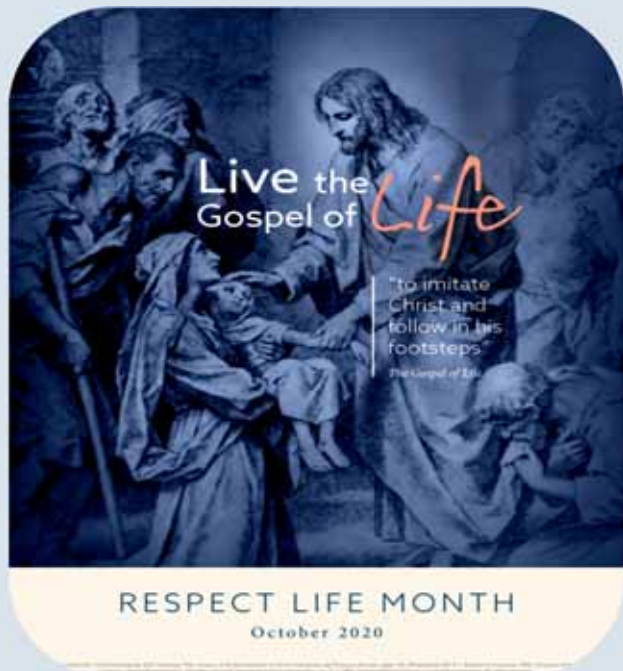
